Job profile: What you will do

- Teaching in the Institute's degree programmes (10 SWS per semester, for BA and MA students as well as teacher training students, in particular the lecture "Introduction to Political Theory");
- Research and publication activities in the field of political theory;
- Tasks within the academic self-administration of the Institute.

Your profile and qualifications; what you bring to the table

- You have a completed doctorate in the field of political theory and/or history of ideas and/or political philosophy;
- You have experience in the application of research and analytical methods in classical, modern and post-modern political theory and history of ideas and/or comparative political theory;
- You have teaching experience and are enthusiastic about teaching theoretical content to students; proof of a university teaching certificate is an advantage;
- You are able to cover one or more of the following areas in teaching and research: classical, modern and post-modern political theory or history of political ideas (especially 17th-21st century); comparative political theory; theories of political systems (e.g. theories of democracy); theories of sustainability and/or justice; methods for researching and analysing classical, modern and post-modern political theory;
- You work academically in German and English; knowledge of other languages is an asset;
- You are a reliable and independent team player;
- You are pursuing an academic career and are willing to develop your skills and qualifications in academic work in the social sciences, especially in political theory and the history of ideas;
- You are interested in interdisciplinary co-operation, especially in the various social science disciplines of the Institute;
- You are interested in using concepts and methods of political theory to analyse relevant contemporary political and social challenges and phenomena (e.g. the global challenge of democracy).
